RESOLUTION NO. 008 OF THE YEAR 2017

Councilman Edward S. Slicer offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

TITLE: RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF HARPERSFIELD ADOPTING A NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR PROPOSED LOCAL LAW.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Harpersfield ("Town Board") introduced a proposed local law to provide explicit authority for the Town of Harpersfield Code Enforcement Officer to issue appearance tickets for violations of the Site Plan Review Law and any orders or approvals issued under the Site Plan Review Law and to revise the penalty for violations to provide every person shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each day a violation, disobedience, omission, neglect or refusal shall continue; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has caused to be prepared a Short Environmental Assessment Form ("EAF") pursuant to the mandates of the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") for the proposed Project; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board declared itself Lead Agency pursuant to 6 NYCRR part 617.6(b)(1) and determined the proposed local law would be reviewed as an unlisted action under SEQRA; and

WHEREAS, on July 11, 2017, the Town Board duly considered the contents of the EAF for the Project and completed parts 2 and 3; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board determined that the local law would not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has taken a "hard look" at the relevant areas of environmental inquiry and did not identify any potential significant adverse impacts related to the proposed amendments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF HARPERSFIELD, DELAWARE COUNTY, NEW YORK:

THAT THE Town Board of the Town of Harpersfield hereby determines that the adoption of the proposed local law will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby authorizes filing of the Negative Declaration for the proposed local law (attached hereto and made a part hereof), according to SEQRA,

6 NYCRR Part 617; and 37 CFR 1.106.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Attorney and Town Clerk are directed to take such further steps as might be necessary to discharge the Town Board's responsibility as lead agency for this action.
